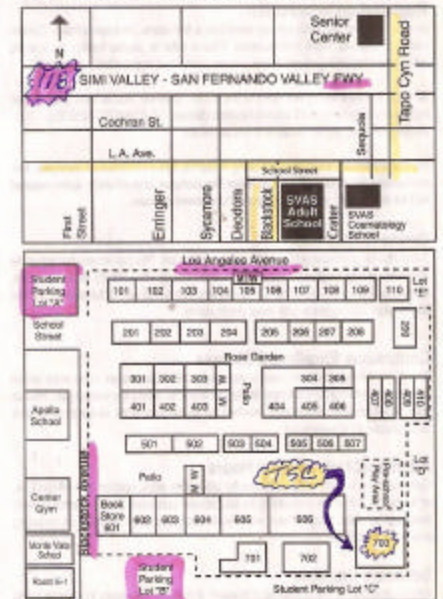
Directions

From San Fernando Valley:

118 Fry, west to Simi Valley, Tapo Canyon Road east (left at bottom of freeway ramp). South to Los Angeles Avenue. Los Angeles Avenue west (right) one mile to Blackstock Ave. Turn south (left) at Blackstock Ave., one block to adult school (on left). Student parking is available on School Street and south of the student store (the adult school is approximately 15 minutes from Topanga Canyon Blvd).

From Thousand Oaks:

23 Fry, north to 118 Fry, east to Simi Valley, Sycamore Drive exit (right at bottom of freeway ramp). South to Los Angeles Avenue. Los Angeles Avenue east (left) to Blackstock Ave. Turn south (right) at Blackstock Ave., one block to adult school (on left). Student parking is available on School Street and south of the student store (the adult school is approximately 20 minutes from Thousand Oaks).
